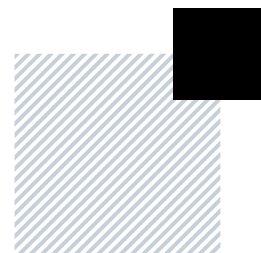


Description

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The concept of global citizenship has prominently emerged in much of the language that is being used to prioritize the internationalization of higher education and the undergraduate experience. Although it remains a highly contested concept that scholars continue to discuss and debate from a variety of theoretical and philosophical perspectives, many agree that graduating global citizens has become central to the many goals of contemporary higher education. This session will present one attempt to define and operationalize this term, with the goal of discussing the extent to which the University of Bamberg is graduating students that have made progress in their development as global citizens. The session will present an interactive toolkit developed for educators.

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Biography

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Dr. Anthony C. Ogden is the founder and managing director of Gateway International Group, an organization focused on next generation international education. He is a respected scholar-practitioner with nearly 30 years of experience in international higher education, having held senior international leadership positions at Pennsylvania State University, the University of Kentucky, Michigan State University and the University of Wyoming. A three-time Fulbright recipient, Dr. Ogden completed a doctorate at Pennsylvania State University in Educational Theory and Policy with a dual title in Comparative and International Education. He has produced over 60 professional and scholarly publications focused on international higher education, including the 2020 co-edited book, *Education Abroad: Bridging Scholarship and Practice* (Routledge).

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
