Short Outline

This two-day online-workshop provides an overview of Multilevel Modeling, or MLM, the appropriate term for what many call hierarchical linear modeling. During the workshop Prof Nezlek will provide a rationale for using MLM, and will explain different aspects of MLM such as centering and modeling error terms. Step by step instructions for conducting multilevel analyses using the program HLM will be presented, and these instructions will be linked to data sets and program files that will be provided to participants. During the second day, you will discuss HLM analyses in more detail, and participants will be able to conduct analyses of their own data with the instructor's assistance. If participants do not have their own data, they can analyze example data sets. During both days, how to prepare raw data for MLM analyses will be discussed. Note: The HLM program runs only on Windows.

The workshop is mainly aimed at doctoral members of Bamberg Graduate School of Social Sciences and Leibniz Institute for Educational Trajectories. In case of any vacant places, it is open to anyone interested.

Prerequisites

Participants should be familiar with OLS (ordinary least squares) regression analyses.
