#### **Short Outline**

In this course, we are focussing on the whole process of preparing and publishing an academic article. In the first online meeting, we discuss the basics of how to write an effective abstract and prepare a manuscript for publication; we also have a closer look at the peer-review process and how to professionally deal with textual criticism.

For preparing the second meeting, participants are required to work on their own projects. Either they use a project they already have, or they start a new one. During this phase, participants are getting writing impulses and guidance from the trainer as needed.

In the second meeting, we are simulating a real-life peer-to-peer review process. In this process, participants are taking both the role of reviewer and reviewed scientists whose articles are discussed and feedbacked. In this part, we learn more about how to revise texts.

#### **Learning objectives**

After the workshop, participants are able to:

- Describe the publication process of academic articles and know about typical dos and don'ts in this process.
- · Name possible obstacles during the publication of their texts.
- · Write effective abstracts.
- Prepare their manuscripts for a publication in an academic journal.
- Deal with critical feedback professionally and use it productively in their texts.
- · Give and take feedback on academic texts.
