The Society of Exponentiality **From the End of Growth to Stabilizing the World**

Professor Dr Emanuel Deutschmann
Europa Universität Flensburg

Emanuel Deutschmann is an Assistant Professor of Sociological Theory at the University of Flensburg and an Associate of the EUI's Migration Policy Centre. His research interests cover topics such as transnational mobility and migration, regional integration and globalization, power law structures, and human behavior under uncertainty.

At first glance, progress in AI, waves of infection, and the climate crisis may seem to have little to do with each other, but they are interrelated and follow the same basic pattern: an exponential curve, which can trigger severe crises. New conflicts emerge, where stabilizationists campaign for appropriate measures, while expansionists push for continued growth. This talk presents these ideas from the book (Suhrkamp, 2025) and also contrasts them with other sociological diagnoses like risk society (Beck), acceleration (Rosa), and the society of singularities (Reckwitz).
