## The Politics of Gendered Taxation

## Professor Dr Laura Seelkopf Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich

Laura Seelkopf is a Professor of comparative public policy at Geschwister-Scholl-Institute for Political Science of LMU Munich. Her research lies at intersection of international political economy, comparative politics, and public policy. She is also interested in research design, experiments, and quantitative methods.

Governments worldwide continue discrimination of their female citizens. Tax system presents a visible example of such inequity, with women often facing higher tax rates than men. Despite the developments, policies vary widely across and within countries. This lecture presents findings from a survey experiment in four European nations, exploring the roots of gender-based discrimination.
