Colloquium: Governance of Complex Systems V - Colloquium

Short Description:

The Kolloquium is addressed to students writing their bachelor or master thesis in political science, specifically with the focal point in the governance of complex technological systems. Possible topics include (but are not limited to): governance, policy and politics complex systems, technological systems, infrastructure, urban planning, ICT, qualitative methods, mixed-methods and evolutionary theories. Please contact the instructor if you are not sure whether your preferred topic would fit in or not.

During the Kolloquium, students will be required to give a presentation on their on-going thesis to receive feedback on their work. A presentation schedule will be organised among the participants. When no presentation is scheduled, the teacher will give instructions on how to structure an academic work (in this case a thesis) according to the main conventions and standards in academic writing in English in order to help you writing up your thesis.

Note:

Students should write their thesis in English but, upon request with the teacher, students may write their thesis in German should they really wish so.

Course structure:

The seminar will be taught in English. The lectures will take place online (Zoom). Further information on online lectures will be shared in due time on VC. If possible and allowed, occasional face-to-face lectures might be organised following the current hygienic rules and regulations.
