

TYPES OF COURSES

Seminar	Seminars, in which students must participate actively and regularly, provide scholarly
	discussion in specific academic fields. Seminars may be subdivided into introductory
	seminars, proseminars, and main seminars, depending on the field of study and the students'
	academic level.
Introductory	Attendance in this type of seminar is compulsory at the beginning of undergraduate
Seminar	programmes and a requirement for participation in proseminars. In introductory seminars,
	students are taught the basics and foundations of the field.
Proseminar	Proseminars are offered on undergraduate level. Students may select from a range of
	proseminars and are required to prove their knowledge of the specific topic by giving an
	oral presentation and/or by writing a term paper.
Main	Main seminars are offered on graduate level. Academic level and requirements are
Seminar	higher than in proseminars. In main seminars, students can extend and deepen their
	knowledge of a specific topic by giving an oral presentation and/or by writing a term paper.
Lecture	An educational talk to a student audience. Discussions between the lecturer and students
	are not common. Usually, students are graded on the basis of a written exam. Like
	exercises, lectures can be combined with a seminar to form a module, in which case they
	may be ungraded.
Exercise	Exercises offer students an opportunity to learn and practice subject-specific techniques
	and methodologies. They often cover the same topic as a seminar or lecture and can be
	combined with either to form a module.

	A language class. Students acquire theoretical knowledge of a language and apply it in
Language	speech and writing. Language classes can be both general (CEFR level) and specific
Skills	(Grammar, Phonetics, etc.).
Tutorial	Tutorials offer students an opportunity to review and practice what has been covered in a
	seminar or lecture and to ask questions. Tutorials are usually offered by advanced students
	who help younger students to prepare for the final examination.







BA Studium Generale: as part of a regular module (2 ECTS), or individually as "Modul Studium Generale" (3 ECTS)

3. Requirements for successful completion of the course:

2 ECTS in all modules for degree-seeking students of the University of Bamberg except those special cases mentioned below: none, BUT REGULAR ATTENDANCE IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED!

Special cases:

- 2 ECTS (Erasmus and other visiting students; ungraded or pass/fail): regular attendance
- 2 ECTS (MA English and American Studies: Consolidation Module Linguistics I): oral examination together with the seminar in the module (30 minutes in all)
- 2 ECTS (Grundlagenmodul "Kulturelle und Medienbildung A"): oral exam (20 minutes)
- 3 ECTS (BA Studium Generale): oral exam (20 minutes)
- 4 ECTS (Lehramt RS/Gym: Grundlagenmodul "Kulturelle und Medienbildung A"): written test of 90 minutes
- 2 ECTS (Erasmus and other visiting students only; graded): written test of 45 minutes
- 4 ECTS (Erasmus and other visiting students only; graded or pass/fail): written test of 90 minutes
- 5 ECTS (MA Medieval Studies Intensivierungsmodul): oral examination of 30 minutes

Inhalt

Description:

Why is English like that? Why is *knight* spelled with a *kn* and a *gh*? Why does English have so many synonyms, like *start*, *begin*, *commence* or *clever*, *intelligent*, *astute* and *bright*? How come that we hardly have any, in fact only eight, inflectional endings in English today? And how are German and English related, as they obviously are --- just compare, for instance, *goose* and *Gans*, *house* and *Haus*, *knight* and *Knecht*, *light* and *Licht*?

This lecture addresses all these questions, and more. Students will be given an overview of the development of the English language from its earliest attestations in the late 7th century (Old English) until today in the context of the textual transmission and sociohistorical changes. Selected passages from different periods will be introduced. Special areas of interest are the development of the vocabulary, sounds and spelling, morphology and syntax.

This lecture is particularly designed for students of BA "Anglistik/Amerikanistik", Aufbaumodul (2 ECTS). Students from other BA programmes can earn 3 ECTS points for their Studium Generale (pass/fail; oral examination of 20 minute), and visiting students can earn 2 or 4 ungraded (pass/fail) or graded ECTS points by sitting a written exam. Note that students of *Lehramt Gymnasium* and of B.A. Medieval Studies in their Basismodul must attend the *Uebung* "Englische Sprachgeschichte", not this lecture.


