Our focus is on quantitative methods such as sequence analysis and longitudinal (causal) modelling, complemented with mixed methods.

The Chair is embedded in the <u>Institute for Sociology</u>, which, with a total of 16 professorships, is one of the leading Sociology institutes in Germany and cooperates closely with other research institutions, e.g. the State Institute for Family Research (ifb) and the Leibniz Institute for Educational Trajectories (LIfBi).
