Introductory Seminar International and European Politics

This course is designed as a complement to the introductory lecture on International Relations. The target audience is German first-year students (BA) and exchange students with little or no previous experience in the field of international and European politics. The course structure mirrors the content of the introductory lecture and thus includes an introduction to three main sub-areas of International Relations, i.e. 'Foreign Policy', 'International Institutions', and 'European Integration'. The purpose of the course is to reflect on learnt theories and assumptions, as well as to solidify the knowledge obtained. For this purpose, students are asked to participate in various group assignments with a practical orientation. Participants will learn how to conduct theoretically guided research and how to research primary documents.

Eligibility Requirements:

- The working language of this course is English. Presentations and coursework must also be completed in English. Papers may be written in German. We do not expect perfect oral English.
- Regular attendance and knowledge of the required texts is expected.
- Participants must give a presentation (about 10 min.) supplemented with slides (PowerPoint).
- Participants must actively participate in group works.
- To obtain a certificate, participants must hand in two papers, each comprising roughly five pages.
