as a fixed term civil servant to be filled by 01.04.2025 at the earliest. Following a positive evaluation conducted at the University of Bamberg after five years' time, the successful candidate's position will be commuted to a fully tenured W 3 professorship without public advertisement.

We are looking for candidates with an outstanding track record in the research and application of computational methods in the humanities, cultural studies and human sciences.

In line with the university's research profile, an application focus in the fields of material cultural heritage preservation, sciences concerned with textual tradition, geospatial research or research on digital teaching and learning is of particular interest.

Experience with interdisciplinary co-operation and the acquisition of third-party funding is required. A willingness to collaborate across faculties, for example within the framework of the Center for Innovative Applications of Computer Science (ZIAI), is desirable. In addition to participating in academic self-administration tasks and international cooperation and exchange programs, active collaboration within the TechnologieAllianzOberfranken (TAO) is expected.

Participation in teaching on the Faculty's Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes is part of the duties. In particular, participation in teaching in the Bachelor's minor in Applied Computer Science and in the Master's programme Computing in the Humanities is expected.

The relevant qualifications consist of a completed academic degree, pedagogical aptitude, a particular talent for academic work generally substantiated by the quality of a doctorate, and, in addition to this, further academic achievements. Additional academic credentials must be certified by a habilitation or equivalent academic qualification, which may also have been obtained through activities outside of higher education or within the scope of an assistant professorship.

Concerning tenured positions as a civil servant ("Beamtenverhältnis"), the candidate must be under the age of 52 years at the time of appointment (for exceptional cases see Art. 60 Abs. 3 Satz 2 BayHIG).

Where candidates are otherwise equally qualified, preference will be given to candidates with disabilities.

The Otto Friedrich University of Bamberg has been certified as a family-friendly university by the Hertie Foundation. It is particularly committed to the compatibility of family and working life. It promotes professional equality between women and men and strives to increase the proportion of women in research and teaching and therefore welcomes applications from female academics.
