PREFACE

In 2008 the European Doctoral Seminar had been held first time in Tetovo, Macedonia. Professors and Ph D students from the South East European University have been involved since several years in the activities of the EDS. Therefore the decision to organize the conference in the beautifully located Macedonian town has to be considered as a consequence of these earlier activities. Is was really a pleasure to see the newest geographical extension of the European Doctoral Seminar.

As in all earlier years Ph D students from five countries have introduced the topics they are dealing with in the frame of their doctoral studies, some of these students could already present first results of their research. Comparing the discussed problems with those of earlier years first signs for the formation of scientific workshops could be experienced. Professors in Bamberg, Budapest, Sarajevo, Tetovo and Tirana have attracted some Ph D students to themselves and having involved them into their fields of research: at the universities in Bamberg and Sarajevo public economics have been proved as main focus of research, in Budapest these are problems of spatial economics, in Tirana trade policy and related topics are emphasized and last, but not least, Tetovo seems to become a centre of research in transitional economics. Such kind of concentration of human resources stimulates obviously the efficiency of research within the universities as well as between them, enriching all further EDS conferences.

The second feature of the meeting in Tetovo was the relationship between governments' activities and the behavior of private economic actors, a problem touched or even deeply analyzed in almost all presentations. It has to be considered as important development that the earlier unbalanced approach about the role of economic policy had been retreat into the background. Of course, the private sectors' extremely high importance has been clearly pointed out, but more and more in cooperation with the governmental sector. This development should be reflected in the title of the present book: "Government and Private Sector in Transition Economies".

During the time the participants spent in Tetovo they could experience the attention paid by the representatives of the South East European University to the conference. The meeting with the rector, Professor *Alajdin Abazi*, Member of the Academy of Sciences, was useful for the further cooperation and the warm welcome address given by *Dennis Farrington*, President of the University Foundation Board, is acknowledged by Professors and students.

This is also the place to express our thanks to the local organizers, first of all to Prof. Dr. Abdylmenaf Bexheti (South East European University, Tetovo) and to Abdulmenaf Sejdini for the preparation of the conference. Participants and organizers of the seminar are very grateful to the Deutsche Akademische Austauschdienst and to the Stabilitätspakt for financial support of the eight European Doctoral Seminar.
