The use of storytelling as a method for humane and effective medical practice goes back to antiquity. This international symposium turns to ancient and medieval healing stories and their postmedieval uses to establish premodern Health Humanities as an important field with a long history and as a basic attitude to human care throughout time. The symposium's speakers belong to a consortium of a Horizon Europe project with the title "Storytelling as *Pharmakon* in Premodernity and Beyond: Training the New Generations of Researchers and Professionals in Health Humanities" (StoryPharm) that has been submitted in the framework of Marie Skłdowska-Curie Actions – Doctoral Networks.
